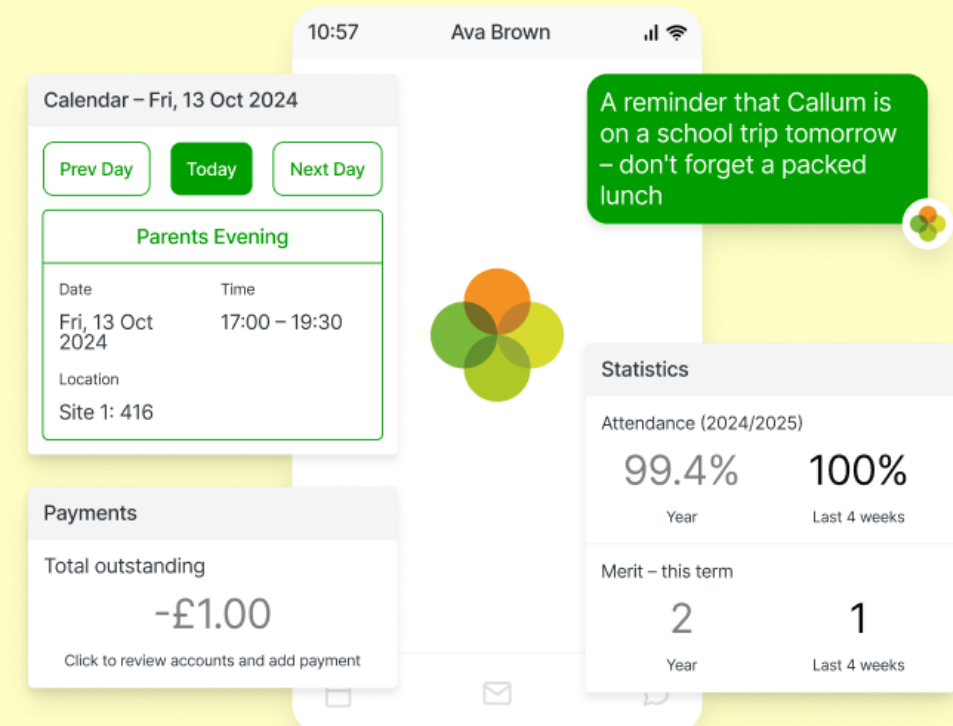

Arbor

Thank you for your patience and understanding as we continue to roll out new features of our school MIS. Look out for notices about how you can book after school clubs in readiness for September. Next term we will continue on our journey to becoming a cashless school. Where you can, we would prefer for payments to be made via Arbor where you can also see your live balance. If you need help with this, please don't hesitate to ask.



★★★★★ Birch Class ★★★★★

English—During our English lessons this term we have concentrated on practicing the skills required to complete the Entry Level 1 assessment that the children will sit early in the next school year. In terms of reading, this has involved looking at short, non-fiction texts and extracting or summarising the key information. With regards to writing, our main goal has been to encourage the children to write short sentences independently on a given subject such as filling out a feedback form to say what they did and did not like about a particular activity.

Maths – Our Maths focus this term has been on number. We first revised adding and subtracting single-digit and two-digit numbers using both written and mental methods before applying this to calculating money. Following this, the children were then taught how to tell time. We started by looking at telling time to the hour and half-hour before moving on to quarter-past and quarter-to. We then completed the term by looking at 2d and 3d shapes, including how to identify the number of faces, edges and vertices.

Topic—This term's topic has been Beach Combers. Having been introduced to the key



features of coastlines, and the way in which they are created, the children then spent a fun filled week at the beach where they were able to take part in yoga, crabbing and sandcastle competitions. Birch Class also had the opportunity to visit the aquarium in a very busy London, and despite all the people and traffic, they had a great time.



Science—In science we have been studying the digestive system. The children were first taught about the different teeth animals have and how this varies depending on whether they are a carnivore, herbivore or omnivore. We then planned and set up an experiment to test the effect of sugar and acidity on tooth enamel by placing eggs into different liquids and leaving them for three weeks. The results were quite eye opening! To conclude the term we looked at the functions of each part of the digestive system.

TERM 6 - 2025

THIS TERM

This term Acorn class have been super busy learning about the very famous Eric Carle. We have been able to explore some of his most popular books; Brown Bear Brown Bear and The Hungry Caterpillar. The children have loved learning how to sign the whole Brown Bear book, and have become experts on signing their animals and colours.

In Maths we have been looking at colours, puzzles and water. We have made our own mini car washes, built giant floor puzzles and even made number caterpillars with paint and balloons.

The children particularly enjoyed their enrichment visits to the Fire Station in Margate and our visit to the RNLI in Ramsgate. They also loved the activities they got to partake in on Beach Week. They did an eye spy walk along the promenade, went crabbing with nets and got to explore the rock pools - finding jellyfish.

They have had a fantastic last term, to end of an incredible year and each one of them has grown in confidence.



This term in Oak Class, we have been exploring a variety of rich sensory experiences as part of our topic, Beachcombers. The children thoroughly enjoyed Beach week and engaging in activities such as our daily stretching, relaxing on sunbeds, crab hunting, beach bowling, and collecting natural materials for use in art projects. We then got creative - using tubes to roll in the sand and build fantastic sandcastles. We also made special keepsakes by creating plaster of Paris handprints with real sand from the beach.



A highlight of the term was our trip to Chessington World of Adventures, where we spent the day in the aquarium observing a wide range of sea life. Using this visit as inspiration, the children later created their own underwater creatures using salt dough.

We've been making the most of the sunshine with nature walks and even some memorable moments walking the alpacas! To top it all off, we are looking forward to our end-of-term trip to Dymchurch Railway, where we will hop aboard the train and spend the afternoon enjoying all the rides at the funfair.
